- 7) Knows that you expect him/her to succeed in school
- 8) Participates in literary activities

## Please consider joining our school Parent Teacher Meetings as our students can greatly benefit from your involvement and contributions to the school and its operation.

As school closures continue to be extended, decisions regarding the grading of assignments, promotion to the next class must be made. After much consideration, the following decisions have been made about those topics.

- In order for a student to be considered "passing" for the year, the student must participate in all categories of assessment.
- Final result for the current scholastic year will be calculated on marks obtained by a student in various assessments conducted by the school.
- Areas of Assessment as per the revised assessment scheme to be followed for promotion to next class.

- CBSE has released a revised assessment scheme, wherein students would be
  assessed not on basis of one year end examination but instead two examinations.
  Splitting the assessment to Term I and Term II, the board has released a Special
  Scheme of Assessment, proposing revised paper patterns and syllabus. This scheme
  would be implemented for the Class 10, 12 Board Examinations 2022.
- The board has decided to conduct Term I and Term II examination in November December and March April respectively. For both the terms, the question papers would be centralized and shared by the Board. Term I would be objective MCQ based paper with OMR sheet while Term II would be a simple subjective paper. In case, however, situations are not conducive, Term II would also be an MCQ based examination. Marks for both terms would be used for computing final score
- The important thing to remember is that the students would have to ensure a year round performance.

- If a student is absent in any one or more test then no marks will be awarded in that category.
- Credits will be given to those who are punctual in attending the online classes.
- It is expected that a student must have 75% attendance to be eligible to appear for the tests/exams.
- Good conduct and discipline along with regularity and punctuality in submitting the assignments, home works, project etc will provide additional credits to the student.
- Our goal is to promote every student to the next class and to ensure that no student is negatively impacted by the unforeseeable circumstances of the COVID-19 closure. In order to do that, we need every parent's help.

It is very important that you and your child are fully informed regarding standards related to appropriate behavior for a safe and productive school year
